Young people aged 16 - 21 yrs who have their Learners. Applicants must also meet the eligibility criteria.

Who can be a volunteer driver?

Any community member with a full Victorian Driver's Licence who is able to give some regular free time to the program and:

- undertake several short training sessions with Vic Roads
- undergo a Police, Working With
 Children and Driver Licence Status
 check all costs paid

Young People are matched with trained volunteers and usually complete 40 – 60 minutes of driving per week. The program vehicle is fully insured, air conditioned and has a 4 star crash safety rating.
